## Class A - Flower Arrangements

1. Bon Appetit - a dining table centrepiece of fresh flowers arranged in a bowl. Overall height not to exceed 10".
2. Fall Breezes - an arrangement of grasses, seed pods, flowers and/or berries. May include foliage.
3. Bloomin' Green - an arrangement of different kinds of foliage only in a recycled container. Maximum height 10", fresh or dried.
4. Wear is my garden? Arrangement on a piece of clothing or hat.

## Class B - Flowers

1. Asters - Any colour, five stems of flowers.
2. Begonias - Tuberous, three (3) blooms floating in shallow dish of water.
3. Chrysanthemums - Outdoor grown, any variety three (3) stems of flowers.
4. Dahlias - Five (5) named varieties, one stem each.
5. Dahlias - One (1) bloom, Decorative. Blooms to be six inches or over.
6. Geraniums (Pelargonium) - Any colour, three stems, own foliage optional.
7. Gladioli - any colour, three (3) spikes.
8. Marigolds - blooms to be $11 / 2$ " to 3 " diameter, 3 blooms.
9. Marigolds - blooms to be under 1 1/2" diameter, 3 blooms.
10. Nasturtiums - three (3) stems
11. Petunias - Five (5) blooms with own foliage
12. Roses- Hybrid Tea - one (1) any colour with own foliage. Variety named. Bloom to be $2 / 3$ to $3 / 4$ open.
13. Roses - Floribunda - one (1) spray any colour, with own foliage, variety named.
14. Roses - Miniature rose, three (3) blooms, any colour, with or without side buds.
15. Snapdragons - three (3) spikes, any colour, any type.
16. Zinnia - any type, five (5) blooms.
